MEMO TO FILE

Memo authored by Colonel Kenneth Hayden, dated December 19, 2022
Administrative Inquiry 202241-03 was initiated on April 16, 2022, in regards to a series of events which began with the arrest and booking of Timothy Peters. A review of the actions taken by Hernando County Sheriffs Office personnel involved has been completed. In regards to SOP 7050.28, Use of Physical Restraining Device and General Order 7050.57, Use of Physical Force, no violations of these policies were found during the in-house investigation.

Case Status: Closed - No Further Action Required

SYNOPSIS

On 4/15/2022, Mr. Peters was still incarcerated in the Medical Wing of the Detention Center. Due to erratic behavior, he was to be transferred to an impact resistant cell. Detention Deputies entered the cell to assist Mr. Peters in cleaning up. At this point, he was covered in his own fecal matter. He was placed into a wheelchair and brought to the shower. While cleaning Mr. Peters up, he began resisting placement in the Pro-Straint Chair. Mr. Peters had a spit mask placed over his face, as he was attempting to spit on deputies. At some point, Mr. Peters went limp and stopped responding. Upon noticing this, deputies began life saving measures. Mr. Peters was brought to the hospital where he ultimately expired.

This inquiry will be to review the incident and specifically, SOP 7050.28, Use of Physical Restraining Device; and General Order 7050.27, Use of Physical Force. The inquiry will also be to ensure all Sheriff's Office policies and procedures were followed.

FINDINGS

Following are the findings of this Internal Affairs investigation, based on sworn testimony, evidence and investigation:

SOP 7050.28, Use of Physical Restraining Device

General Order 7050.27, Use of Physical Force

Deputies followed all policies and procedures established by the Hernando County Sheriff Office involving the intake, care, and custody of Mr. Peters.

There were no violations of the above policies or procedures in reference to this incident. There is a recommendation the policy regarding spit masks be modified to disallow the use of multiple masks unless exigent circumstances are involved.
